LIP HEALING PROCESS

IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE PROCEDURE

In the first hour after the procedure, clients can experience a burning or tingling sensation;

Swelling may remain for up to

3-4 DAYS AFTER THE PROCEDURE

The peeling stage begins: part of the pigment disappears with the peeling crusty particles of the epidermis.

5-7 DAYS AFTER THE PROCEDURE

Full exfoliation.

28-30 DAYS AFTER THE PROCEDURE

After the completion of the regeneration process, the final color sets in.

CORRECTION

The final stage of the primary procedure to correct color, symmetry, shape and saturation.

LIP POST PROCEDURE CARE

IMMIDEATELY AFTER THE PROCEDURE:

- Possible swelling and redness around the lips;
- Initially the color will be fairly bright;
- Swelling can subside unevenly therefore causing initial asymmetry.

ONE MONTH +

- Until completely healed, it is recommended to avoid all cosmetic procedures;
- To avoid color inversion it is recommended to apply SPF 50 sun protection;

ABSOLUTELY NO CARBOXYLIC ACID EXFOLIATION at the treatment area.

THE FIRST 24 HOURS:

- No brushing your teeth;
- Exercise caution while eating, open your mouth widely;
- Drink only through the straw;
- · No alcohol.

THE FIRST 3-5 DAYS:

- ⊗ NO kissing;
- ⊗ NO oral petting or sex;
- NO physical exercise or sports (to avoid increased body heat).

PREVENTION:

Continue to take antivirals for 5-6 days.

If herpes still appears, the use of patches is recommended

PREPARATION FOR LIP BLUSH PROCEDURE

Correct preparation for the permanent lip makeup procedure guarantees excellent result.

IT IS IMPORTANT:

Five days before the procedure start to moisturize your lips heavily with any lip moisturizer.

Here are some good ingredients to look for:

- Beeswax
- · Oils and infusions
- · Shea butter
- Jojoba oil

Two or three days before the procedure start exfoliating your lips with fine texture scrubs.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended to take a course of antiviral medicines. Often a side effect of any lip treatment procedure is herpes. It is not caused by lack of sterility or a failed procedure. However, during the procedure the top skin layers are punctured causing nerve endings irritation, which in turn can provoke herpes.

It is not required, but recommended to take antiviral medication as a measure to prevent herpes infection.

LIP BLUSH

HOW TO CARE FOR THE LIPS AFTER THE PERMANENT MAKEUP PROCEDURE

- Wipe the treatment area with soapy water;

 Use shea butter and/or jojoba oil until
 - Use shea butter and/or jojoba oil until healed

2 Do not remove, roll or brush off the crust.

If the lips are excessively dry, this is not normal. Get tested to see if you have a vitamin deficiency.

Once healed, permanent lip makeup appears very light. This is how it should be. It is like a light shadow on the skin.

Permanent lip makeup is not a lipstick. It is pigment implantation under the skin.
